**Important Information:**

- When a US tax filer earns income from another country, a portion of that income can be excluded from the U.S Taxable income and IRS Form 2555 is used. The figure resulting figure is then included within Schedule 1.
  - On the 24-25 FAFSA, this information is reported on the Foreign Earned Income Exclusion line.
- If the student, or their parents, earned income in another country and paid taxes to a foreign government, the income and taxes paid will be treated the same as U.S income and taxes paid.
  - The student, or their parents, will report the information from the foreign tax return on the FAFSA. This will be considered equivalent to an IRS Form 1040.
- If foreign income was earned, but foreign taxes were not paid, it should be reported as income earned from work.
- Applicants must use current conversions to report the correct amount in U.S. dollars. Mary Baldwin University will not accept foreign tax returns that have not been converted to USD.

  - EXCEPT for dependent students, verification of non-filing for individuals who would file a return with a relevant tax authority other than the IRS dated on or after October 1, 2023.
